which warrant a review of a player's team assignment, the matter should first be discussed with the team coach and the Division Director who will review the situation with the Player Agent. A player's team assignment cannot be changed purely for the convenience of the player or the parents. Players are assigned for Boys grades 1 and 2 and Girls grades 1/2 teams by the CYBA Division Director and the Player Agent. For all divisions, the coaches will contact each player after the draft/team assignment process is complete to schedule a parent meeting.

Player Requests

CYBA will try to honor Boys grades 1 and 2 and the Girls 1/2 player requests for team placement (i.e., carpools, etc.). Player requests cannot be honored in all other divisions since they involve a player draft.

8.0 UNIFORMS & EQUIPMENT

All players are provided with a uniform prior to opening day. In all divisions, players are allowed to keep their shirts and shorts. Players are expected to provide proper basketball shoes (no colored rubber on the soles that can markup the gym floors).

9.0 REGULAR PLAYING SEASON

Opening Day - Opening Day is **December 5, 2009**. During the season, teams practice twice per week and play one game per week. Players must be committed to their team for the entire season through the playoffs. League schedules attempt to accommodate conflicts such as School and holidays.

Regular Season Games - CYBA starts regular season games on **Saturday, December 5th**. Weekday practices start on November 2, 2009. Teams are allowed to scrimmage on their own time during the practice week. CYBA tries to schedule 10 regular season games for all teams in each division.

All League games are held on Saturdays. Every team is allowed 3 hours of practice during the week which by most coaches is broken up to 2, 1 1/2 hour practices. Games cancelled or postponed by gym availability or other reason may be rescheduled if possible, with priority given to competitive games.

Regular Season Tournaments - For all competitive divisions, all teams compete in post-season playoffs to determine division championships. Regular season games (won-loss records) are used to seed teams in the playoffs.

Picture Day - Picture Day is on **Sunday, December 13th 2009**. The cost of team and individual pictures is included in registration fees. Pictures are distributed to each team later in the season. Team pictures and other league information are published on the CYBA website.

Championship Day - Championship Day is on **March 6th 2010**, and is the culmination of the CYBA regular season. Championship games for all grade divisions are held at all 4 CYBA gyms to determine a division champion. Awards and trophies are distributed on Championship Day, which include participation awards in non-competitive divisions, and 1st and 2nd place trophies in competitive divisions.

All-Stars - CYBA hosts an All-Star game for each grade division. The All-Star game/weekend is on March 13th 2010. Each player selected to the all-Star team for their grade division must have been on the active roster of a CYBA team in the appropriate age group or division and played in 50% of the games. Players are selected by the regular season coaches of the appropriate age group. Coaches for the all-star teams are first offered to the 1st and 2nd place coaches of the respected division. If a coach is still not in place for the all-star team names can be submitted for selection. To be considered for a post-season position, with selection based on criteria established by the Board, contact your Division Director. Post-season players must be committed to their team for the duration of post-season play, and are expected to decline the invitation to play if conflicts are anticipated, so that other players may have the opportunity to participate.

10.0 Official Rules & Supplemental Rules

CYBA is conducted according to official CIF Basketball rules published by the CIF. CYBA publishes supplemental rules for various divisions to insure age appropriate regulations are in place. All coaches receive a copy of the CIF rule book and the appropriate supplemental rules prior to the season.

Referees - A Minimum of 2 referees are provided for each CYBA game. They are impartial observers of the game, assigned to keep the game fair for all involved. If there is a dispute, **only the head coach** is entitled to discuss the matter with the referee. Support of the referees by the coaches, players and fans helps maintain the integrity of the game. Interference, disrespect, or intimidation of the referee is not in the spirit of the CYBA and is not tolerated. Referees are required to take classroom and court instruction, and are tested on their knowledge and ability to perform these duties. Referees are assigned to games commensurate with their abilities. Referees must be at least 14 years old and in High School. Anyone interested in becoming a referee should contact the Director of Referees.

The divisions are split up by grade. Each grade division has their own set of supplemental rules to fit with the level of basketball each grade division will be playing. All players in these grade divisions are drafted onto teams after participating in the tryout. All players are required to attend the tryouts.

Girls Grades 3 – 8- This is where the competitive basketball starts for the Girls divisions. The division are split up by grade (Grades 3/4 play together, Grades 5/6 play together and Grades 7/8 play together). Each grade division has their own set of supplemental rules to fit with the level of basketball each grade division will be playing. All players in these grade divisions are drafted onto teams after participating in the tryout. All players are required to attend the tryouts.

High School Divisions - This division is new to CYBA this year. Please see the league website www.cyba.org for more information or contact Terence Gelke.

6.1 REGISTRATION and FEES

Registration fees for the 2009/10 season are \$175 for all participants and \$165 for each additional child for families with more than one child. To register and pay on-line, (there is an additional fee) visit our website www.cyba.org, fill in the appropriate information, print the confirmation page and bring that page to evaluation/tryouts. You can also register by mail or at our walk-up registration dates and evaluation dates (see calendar on the inside cover of this Orange Book). On-line or walk up registrations received after October 17th (or post marked after October 17th) will be \$200 (\$25 late fee in addition to \$175 registration fee). No refunds will be made after October 20, 2009. All refunds after this date will need board approval.

In addition each team must obtain a team sponsor who will make a tax deductible contribution of \$250. If a team cannot obtain a sponsor then the parents of the team are obligated to become the team sponsor. Sponsors will receive a team plaque, recognition by way of a 'Thank You' letter, newspaper ad listing all sponsors, and a 'Thank You' in the following years 'CYBA Orange Book'. Registration fees and sponsorships programs do not cover the costs of the entire CYBA Program. Supplemental income is derived from our fund raising events.

7.0 EVALUATION AND THE DRAFT

Players are assigned to teams with the objective of providing balanced competition between teams in the same division. In all divisions except for Boys and Girls grades 1 and 2, a draft is conducted. All players who register with CYBA by October 17th will be assigned to a team. Those who register late (after October 17th) will be placed on a waiting list until or if there is an opening in an appropriate grade division. The CYBA Player Agent and board of directors administers the player assignment and draft process in all divisions. The CYBA Draft is on October 20th 2009.

All players must be evaluated. It is important to review the evaluation schedule closely and identify the location, date and time for which evaluation/tryouts of your particular age group will be occurring.

Players who do not attend evaluation will be assigned to a team as space permits in accordance with CYBA regulations. All coaches must attend evaluation/tryouts to evaluate the players, who are asked to demonstrate their ability in Free Throws, Shooting, Dribbling, Running and Team Play.

Players should bring their basketball shoes (no colored rubber soles that can mark the gym floors). Players should dress appropriately for basketball. Basketballs are provided, players are encouraged to bring a ball to warm up on the outside courts before their evaluation. Evaluation/Tryouts are conducted on a first come, first serve basis, changes to this evaluation/tryout order cannot be accommodated unless deemed necessary by the Division Director.

5.0 CYBA PRACTICE AND GYM LOCATIONS

The gyms for the CYBA games are Redwood MS, Los Cerritos MS, Colina MS and TOCC (Thousand Oaks Community Center). Practice courts include TOCC, Acacia, Aspen, Redwood MS (Has Lights) and Los Cerritos MS (Has Lights). The game and practice courts are the property of the Conejo Recreation and Park District and the Conejo Valley School District. Permits are obtained by the CYBA to use these facilities during the CYBA season. Upkeep during the season is the responsibility of each CYBA team who uses them. Refer to the CYBA Website at www.cyba.org for maps and locations of all the Practice Courts and Gyms. Practices should only be at the listed sites. Use of unauthorized playing or practice courts by CYBA teams is at the risk of said team and coaches and is not covered by CYBA insurance.

5.1 CYBA LEAGUE FORMAT

The CYBA Provides two basic programs: The **Intramural Program** and the **Travel Team Program**.

TRAVEL TEAM PROGRAM: Participants are selected for the Travel Team during the Travel Team tryouts. Everyone in each division (4th through 8th grade for boys, and 5th grade through 8th grade for girls) is encouraged to tryout for the

Traveling Teams. The Travel Teams play at a higher level of competition and participate in the VCYBC (Ventura County Youth Basketball Conference) against teams from other communities. The Travel Teams are the representatives for the CYBA in the VCYBC. Being selected for a Travel Team does come with more financial requirements other than just CYBA Registration. You can talk with the coaches at the tryouts to understand those requirements.

INTRAMURAL PROGRAM: All other participants are assigned to the intramural program. These teams compete against each other during the season. ALL PARTICIPANTS IN THE INTRAMURALS GRADES 1 THROUGH 12 ARE GUARANTEED TWO QUARTERS OF UNINTERRUPTED PLAY DURING EACH GAME. (To be eligible, players must abide by the league rules and participate in team practices). Due to limited availability of facilities some games could be outdoors and/or on Sundays, although every effort is made to secure facilities for Saturday indoor play only.

6.0 LEAGUE AGE & DIVISIONS

What is CYBA Age?

A player's "CYBA age" is the grade the player will be in during the CYBA season. The playing divisions of CYBA are:

Boys and Girls 1st and 2nd Grade - This division is strictly instructional and noncompetitive and is a great place for the kids to start learning and developing basketball skills. This division provides a fun environment that introduces players to the fundamentals of the game. The baskets are set at 8 feet, the games will be scored and refereed. (1st grade Boys division, 2nd grade Boys division, and 1/2 Girls division.)
Boys Grades 3 – 8 - This is where the competitive basketball starts for the Boys divisions.

3.0 EXPECTATIONS OF PARENTS AND FANS

The main goal of the CYBA is to create the best possible experience for all the players, coaches and referee's. All parents and fans are expected to:

- be supportive of the coaches and team;
- communicate with the coaches in appropriate ways;
- cheer for all players on the team;
- be a positive role model;
- respect and support volunteers and referees;
- be positive and supportive whether the team wins or loses;
- maintain a commitment to the team by insuring the players attend practices and games;
- model good sportsmanship.

3.1 PARENT PARTICIPATION

Parent participation is essential to make *your* CYBA League a success.

Without 100% participation by the families of the CYBA players, we can not be successful.

During player registration and at the initial parents meeting for your team, you will have the opportunity to volunteer for any of the following positions:

Coach - Over 200 coaches are recruited annually to conduct the CYBA program. CYBA runs instructional clinics for coaches each year to enhance the ability of these volunteers to provide your child a safe and positive learning environment. Coaches must apply for a team and submit to an interview conducted by the division director. Coaches are recommended for selection by the appropriate division directors. All coaches are required to conduct a parents meeting prior to the first practice, where you will be provided with the details of the season. Coaches are also required to have a team parent to attend the Team Parent Meeting so that the parents will receive all of the season details.

Team Parent - The team parent has responsibilities that are directly involved with the team: attending the Team Parent Meeting to receive the team packet, assisting the coaches by maintaining the team roster, coordinating post-game snack schedules, making phone calls, organizing the team party, assigning volunteers to work as gym monitors, among other things. This volunteer will also help coordinate the team for picture day as well as fundraising events.

Gym Monitor - To make sure that only water is brought into the gym and that all trash and recyclables are removed from the gym at the end of the game. (The school district has made it clear that no food or other liquids, by parents or children, is allowed in the gyms. Violation of this policy is cause for the school district to remove CYBA from the use of the gyms.)

Point System - Coaches, parents, and children are expected to live up the CYBA code of conduct. Any violation of the code of conduct will affect the team standings. Details will be given out and discussed at your initial team meeting.

4.0 CYBA "Heart of a Champion" Hall of Fame

CYBA "Heart of a Champion" Award

The CYBA award called "Heart of a Champion" was introduced into the CYBA in the 2005/2006 season. This award is presented each season to one graduating 8th grade boy and one graduating 8th grade girl that has participated in the CYBA for 4 or more seasons.

These recipients of this prestigious CYBA award are chosen as being the ones best exemplifying the ideals upon which the CYBA was founded; COMPETITIVENESS, EMPATHY, SPORTSMANSHIP, ACADEMICS and ACCOMPLISHMENT under ADVERSITY.

Players for this prestigious award are nominated by the coaches and division directors of the 8th grade boys and 8th grade girls divisions for the qualifying season. The nominees are collected and then voted upon by these coaches and division directors.

1.0 CYBA MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION

The Conejo Valley Youth Basketball Association (CYBA) was formed to provide an opportunity for girls and boys to participate in an organized basketball program. The Conejo Youth Basketball Association (CYBA) is a non-profit organization composed of a Board of Directors and parents of the participants. The CYBA's continuing objectives are to promote, develop, supervise and voluntarily assist in all lawful ways the interest of those who will participate in the CYBA. The CYBA would also like to emphasize on good sportsmanship, encourage high academic achievement, teach fundamental basketball and have fun. The CYBA is a great organizer of youth Basketball in the Conejo Valley, Westlake, Agoura and Newbury park areas. This is truly a program of service to youth, adapted to the mental and physical capacity of youngsters in a wide range of age groups. CYBA has over 1000 players and over 200 adult volunteers annually. Information on the CYBA can be found at their website at www.cyba.org.

The Board of Directors of CYBA manages the operations and property of the league. Board members are appointed for one-year terms by the general membership of CYBA which includes the parents of all players, plus coaches. The Executive Board Members are elected for 3 year terms which are voted on each year in a general election. The Board meets once a month, except during the playing season when meetings are held every other week.

Players must register on time each year in order to participate in the CYBA. Late registrants will go on a waiting list and will be added to teams if there are opening. CYBA can not guarantee that late registrants will be placed on teams.

The safety of players, Referees, spectators and volunteers is of utmost importance to CYBA. The CYBA coordinates all safety activities, ensures safety in player training, ensures safe playing conditions, coordinates reporting and prevention of injuries, and solicits suggestions for safety improvements and forwards them to the School District. The CYBA for Safety reasons has the ability, as do Referees and Coaches, to halt play to assure the safety of all involved.

2.0 LEAGUE BUDGET & FUNDING

League Operating Expenses

As shown on the charts on the opposite page, approximately 75% of the operating budget comes from registration fees. Sponsors contribute a further 10% and their generous support is recognized in the annual CYBA Orange Book as well as the CYBA Web Page at www.cyba.org. Income Expenses

Registration Costs

CYBA is a non-profit organization that relies on donations made at registration to help pay league expenses. Donation amounts are set at levels the league believes are adequate and fair to cover expenses of play at each level. The League also sets levels for budgeting purposes and base them on anticipated number of players each season and related expenses. As such, the League must make early financial commitments to assure that uniforms, equipment and other materials and supplies are purchased and received in a timeframe that allows practices and games to start on schedule. Therefore, the League cannot refund donations after draft on October 20th 2009 of the playing year. All refunds after October 20th will have to be approved by the board of Directors. Because CYBA is a non-profit organization as allowed by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, all donations are tax deductible.

Scholarships

For the past several years, CYBA has provided scholarships to high school graduates who participated in the CYBA. Scholarships are awarded to individuals who submit an application that includes an essay on "What the CYBA has meant to me", an oral interview, and review of academic information. To qualify, an applicant must have played or refereed (or combination of the two) for at least five years in CYBA. Information / Applications need to be turned in by April 1st 2010.
